What is HIMS?

- HIMS is a SAFETY Program
 - Protect the public / profession
 - Save life of alcohol / drug dependent pilot
 - Save the career of the pilot
 - Resource for the family to get help



What is HIMS?


- HIMS is a MONITORING and SUPPORT Program
 - 14 CFR 67.107 (4), 14 CFR 67.401
 - Substance Dependence is defined there
 - Substance Abuse is equally disqualifying
 - Must have a diagnosis to enter HIMS
 - An extra set of stipulations to be met, much like any other disqualifying medical condition
 - Career abstinence, no return to drinking

What is HIMS?

HIMS is a PROCESS

FAA Special Issuance

- Identification / Evaluation
- Treatment (28 day min)
- Recovery Program (AA/NA)
- Aftercare
- No Notice Alcohol/Drug Testing Regimen
- -P&P
- Special Issuance Monitoring Period (3-5yrs)
- Release from Monitoring



What HIMS is NOT...

- HIMS is <u>NOT a RECOVERY program</u>
 - Recovery is done by personal work, HIMS monitors / supports that work
- NOT an SSRI program
- NOT a hideout for discipline cases
- NOT other addictions (drugs & alcohol only)
- NOT a self help, need to get my life right program
- NOT a control my drinking now drink later program



Who is HIMS?



- Available to ALL pilots, GA to Part 121
- Airline / Corporate run HIMS Programs
 - Team decision making
 - Accountability for all
 - Much more structured

Why do we Need HIMS?

General Population

- 67% of U.S. age 12+ consume alcohol
- 8.9% of U.S. age 12+ use illegal drugs
- 20% of U.S. age 12+ use RX non medically
- 10% of population is Chemically Dependent

Why do we Need HIMS?

Pilots

- Rate of illicit drug use is lower
- Rate of Alcoholism probably the sar
- 5% of all Pilots have 1 DUI
- .5% have 2 or more DUIs
- HIMS Database: Alcohol #1, Cocaine #2
- Less than 2% in HIMS at any given airline



When to Call HIMS?



When to Call HIMS?

- 1. Does your drinking / using cause problems?
 - Legal
 - Relationship
 - Employment



- 2. Can you predict how many drinks you will have and what will happen once you start drinking / using?
 - 3. Do you have to hide your drinking?
 - amounts, bottles, geograpically (pre-drinking / only had 2!)



Many Pilots are "Forced" Into HIMS

- The Problem is:
 Volunteer Only HIMS Programs Do Not Work!
- "We admitted we were <u>powerless</u> over alcohol our lives had become <u>unmanageable</u>"
 - ALL Addicts need <u>Consequences</u> to break delusion



- DUI's
- Trouble on Layovers
- Conflicts with other employees
- On-Duty Positive DOT



Educate, Rehabilitate.....don't Terminate!!

- HIMS has built in "Safety Relief Valves"
 - No medical / license = no flying
 - Monitored return to flight duties
 - Aftercare Contract
 - Revocation of Special
 Issuance





Fundamental Assumptions

- Alcoholism is a **Primary** treatable disease
 -Chronicity -Relapse
- Total abstinence is essential for recovery
- Job motivation yields a high recovery rate
- Family Support is an Important part of the recovery process for the pilot



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- an occupational substance abuse treatment program




